American Red Cross – Visit the American Red Cross and put together Comfort Kits. The Comfort Kits filled with personal toiletry items is one of the services provided "on the spot" after disasters such as residential fires. (redcross.org/Arkansas, redcross.org)

Alexander-Turner Child Development Center – WMS Members will do arts and crafts with students at the center and read to students. We will also have an opportunity to beautify the playground. The center is a Christian-Based early childhood center that addresses the developmental and spiritual needs of children.

The Watershed – WMS Members will box food items for families; sort through clothing and organize by size and gender. We will also do some cleaning of facility. This agency fosters faith and hope in the future by helping people move from dependency to self-sufficiency.

Heifer Internationals – A group of 50-75 WMS will tour the headquarters then select the animals the WMS will purchase. This organization works to end hunger and poverty by providing livestock and training to struggling communities.

Salvation Army – A group of 100 WMS will put together comfort kits and stock the store with supplies.

Rice Depot – Approximately 100 missionaries are needed to repack bulk products. The Rice Depot works to eliminate hunger in the state. This site can accommodate disabled workers.

No-Sew Fleece Blankets (onsite) – 100 blankets will be made. These blankets will be donated.

Backpack Snack Attack – (onsite) – WMS members are asked to bring 100 Backpacks. These backpacks will be stuffed with non-perishable food items, also donated by WMS members and shared with the food pantries at Martin Luther King, Jr. and Dunbar Elementary schools.
